Home Health and Hospice Compliance Management Challenges 2023

Survey Overview

In January 2023, In90group Research conducted a survey with 100 home health and hospice CEOs and financial, operational, and clinical leaders to determine the biggest challenges they face with quality and compliance management.

We asked about how they currently manage their quality and compliance programs, how much time and staff resources are dedicated to compliance, and what are the biggest challenges they are facing when it comes to compliance and quality management. We also asked their opinions on how they believe modern technology could help them more effectively manage quality and compliance programs.

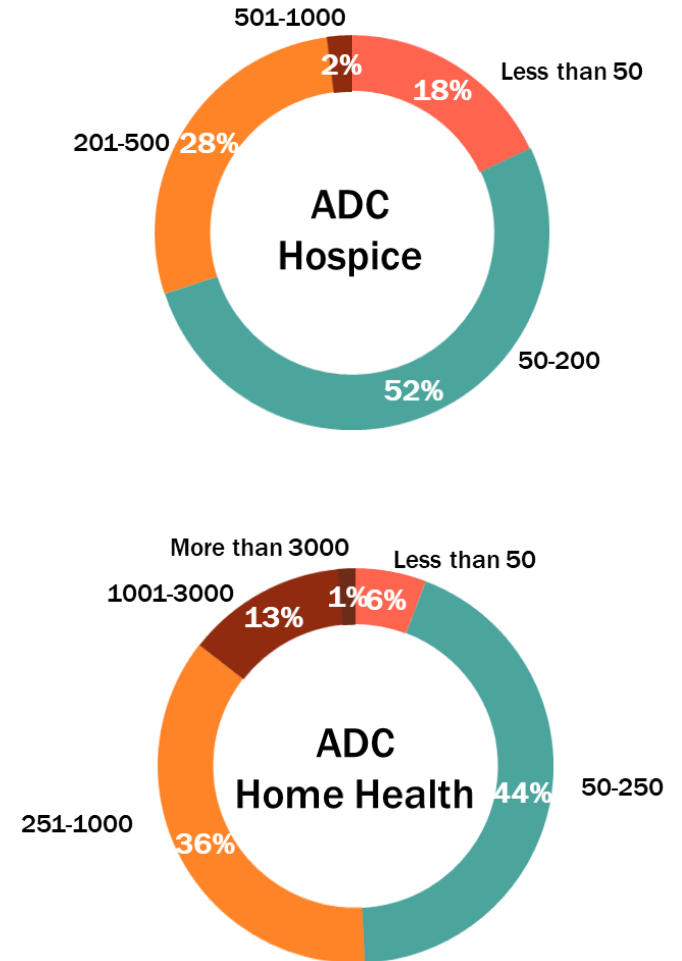
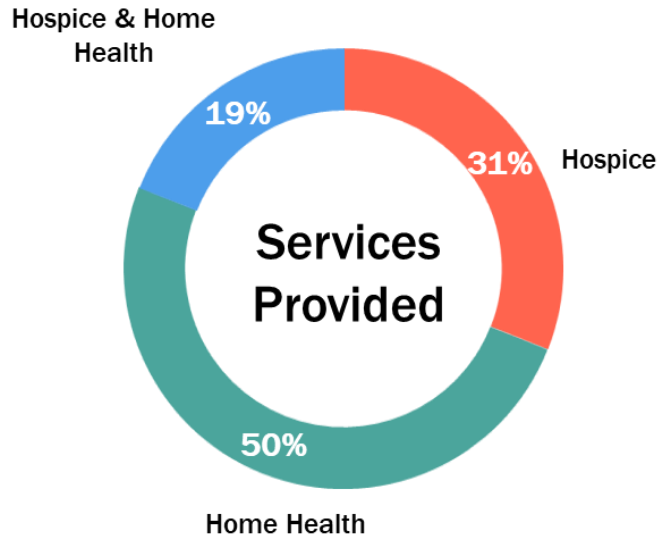
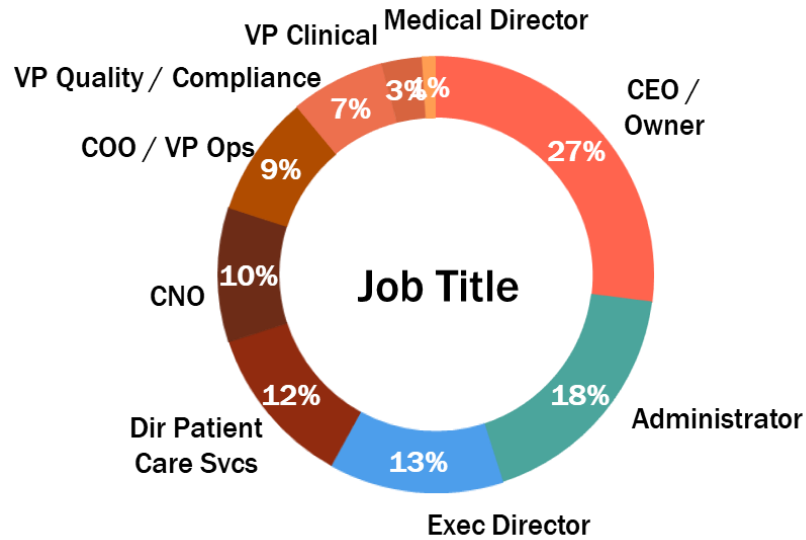
Summary of Results

Home health and hospice organizations understand the benefits of successful compliance but are struggling to dedicate the resources to manage these programs. Leaders communicated a need for automation technology that streamlines workflows and makes compliance easier so that they can focus more on patient care and less on administrative compliance requirements.

- 50%** of respondents are **very concerned** about how prepared they are for value-based care and their ability to successfully adhere to CMS compliance standards.
- 40%** believe they are **not properly staffed** to be successful with compliance.
- 37%** are highly confident their QAPI program is survey ready.
- 90%** would prefer to manage their compliance in house but **lack the time and resources** to be successful and have **difficulty prioritizing compliance** over patient care.
- 84%** want automation technology that **makes compliance easier** and **streamlines workflows**.

Respondent Demographics

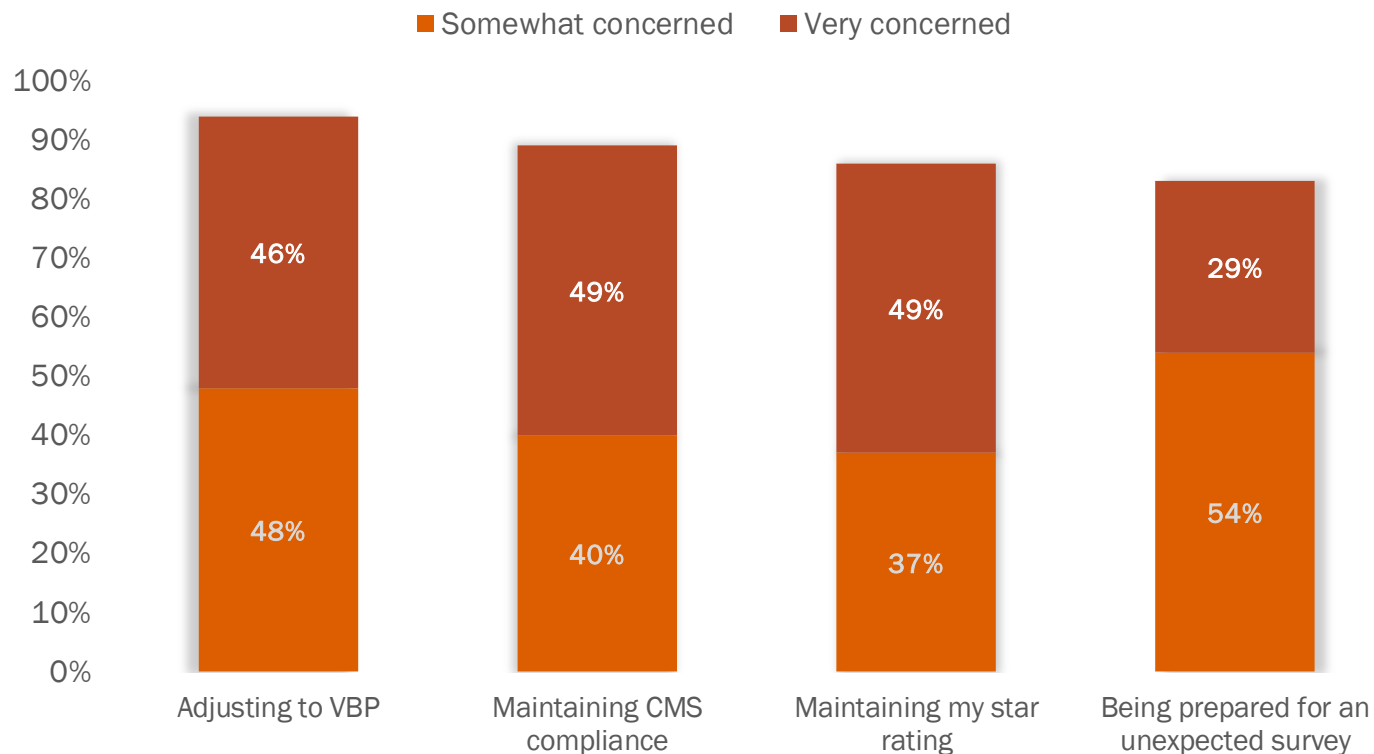
Survey respondents represented executive, clinical and operational leaders, spanning all sizes of home health and hospice organizations.



Leaders expressed significant levels of concern about quality and compliance

While staffing shortages dominate the conversation in home health and hospice, the vast majority of leaders are concerned about critical issues related to quality and compliance, with nearly 50% reporting they are very concerned about their ability to adjust to value-based purchasing models, maintaining CMS compliance and star ratings.

Leaders recognize the benefits of successful quality and compliance programs

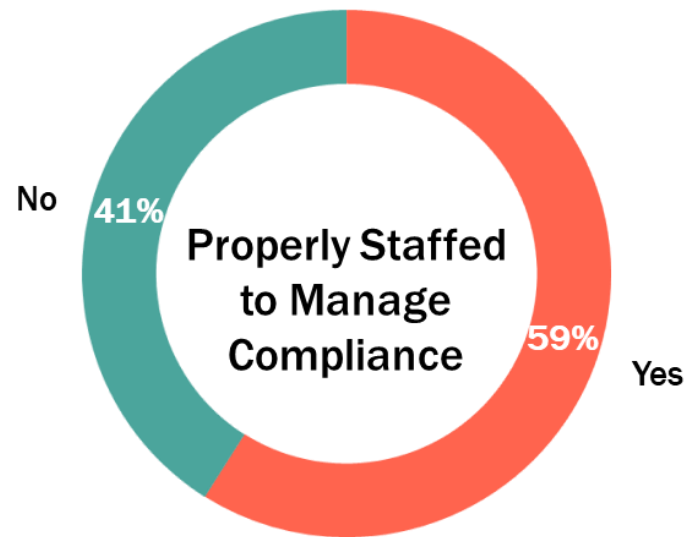
When home health and hospice leaders think about compliance programs such as QAPI, they focus on star ratings, patient satisfaction and clinical staff efficiency as the top three outcomes of successful programs.

BENEFITS OF SUCCESSFUL QAPI PROGRAM



Many home health and hospice organizations are not properly staffed to manage all their compliance programs

Unfortunately, 40% of leaders at home health and hospice organizations do not believe they are properly staffed to manage compliance programs and survey preparation. This is of great concern given the importance of these programs in new value-based care models and the negative ramifications of unsuccessful programs.



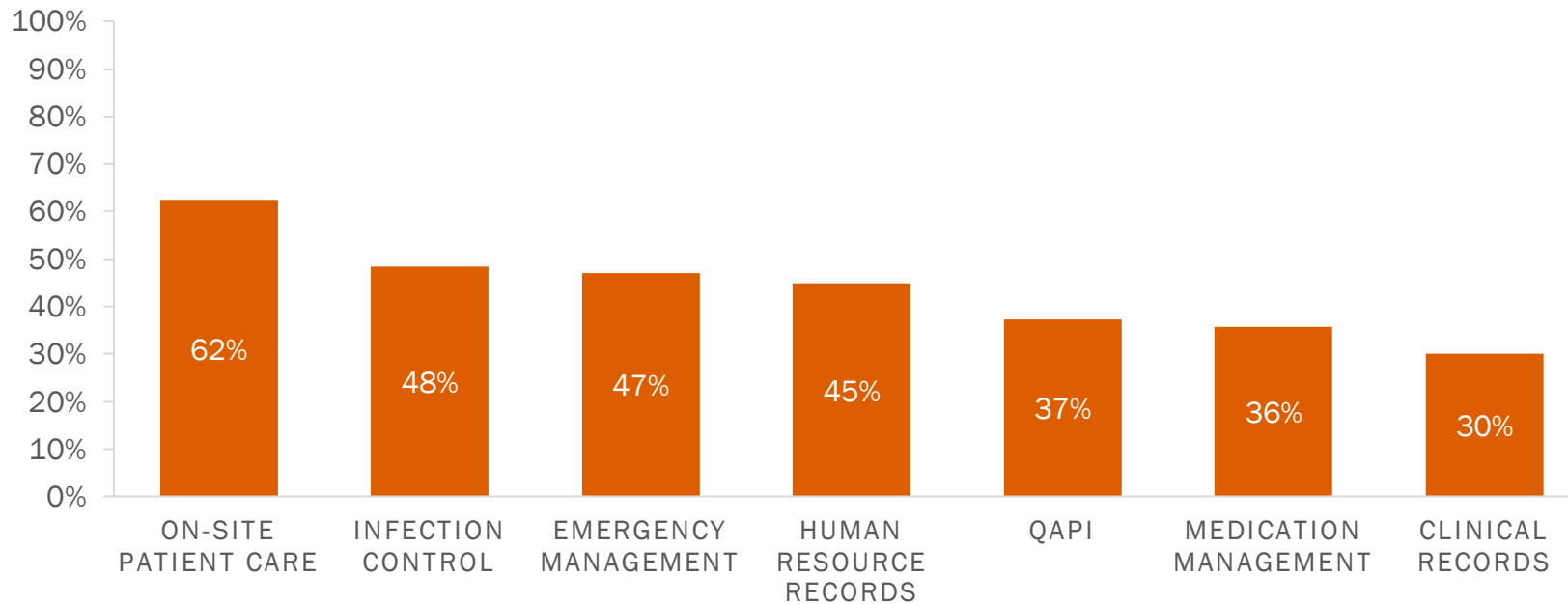
BIGGEST FEARS ASSOCIATED WITH FAILURE IN COMPLIANCE PROGRAMS



Home health and hospice leaders are not highly satisfied with survey readiness

Less than half of respondents are very satisfied with survey readiness on critical infection control and emergency management programs, and only about one-third are very satisfied with survey readiness when it comes to QAPI and medication management programs. While concerning, this may not be surprising given resource constraints, constantly changing regulations and the amount and complexity of paperwork involved.

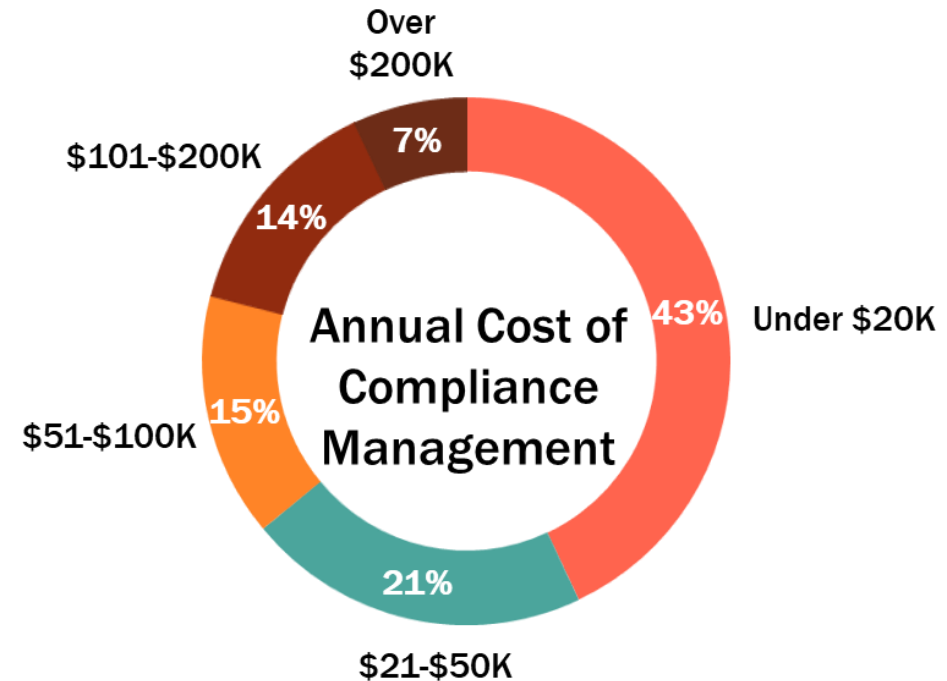
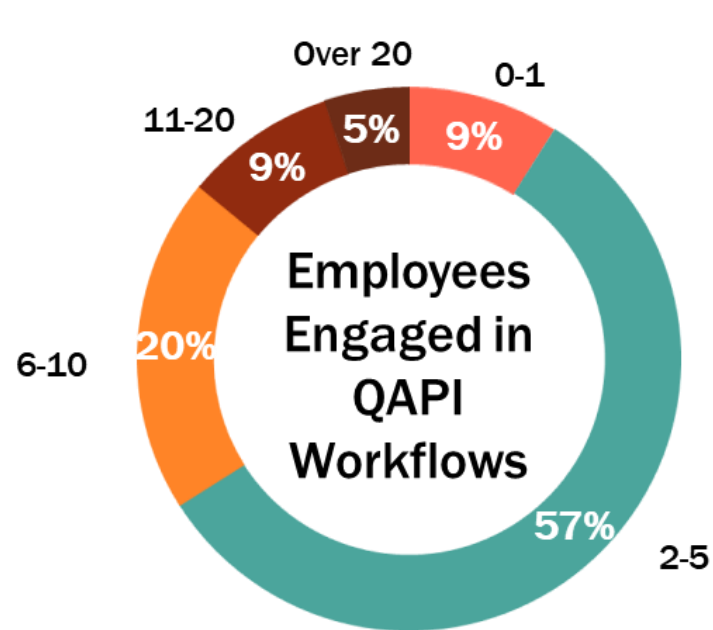
VERY SATISFIED WITH SURVEY READINESS



Home health and hospice organizations are using valuable resources to manage compliance programs that could be utilized for patient care

Nearly 60% of home health and hospice organizations are spending over \$20,000 per year managing compliance, and on average there are 5 employees directly engaged in QAPI workflows alone.

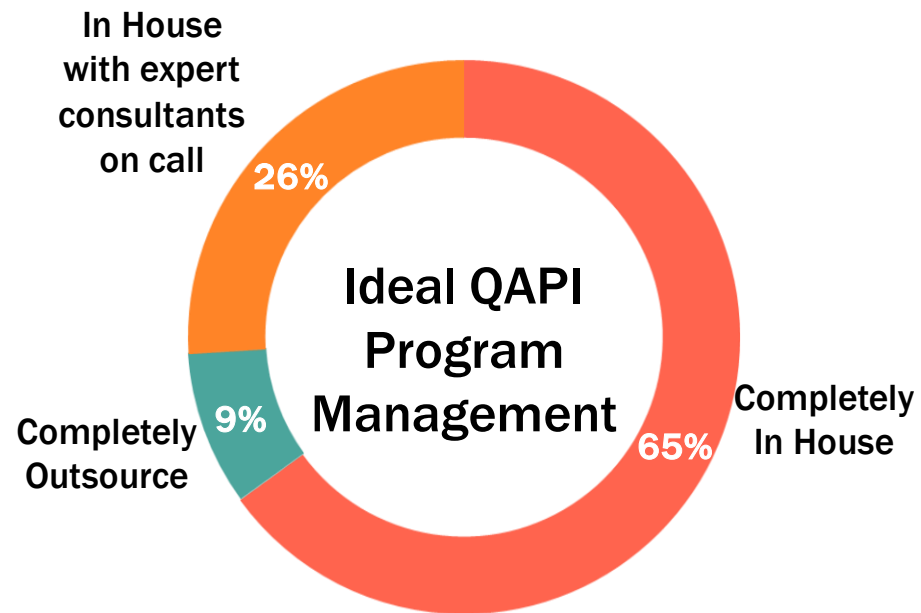
In home health and hospice, resources are not unlimited. The amount of time and money spent directly managing compliance programs directly impacts the amount of resources available to focus on patient care.



Leaders are facing multiple challenges managing QAPI programs

Organizations would like to manage compliance in house; however, lack of time, resources and training means leaders are having difficulty prioritizing QAPI programs on their own.

Organizations need ways to help their resources focus more on improving performance and spend less time on the administrative tasks associated with quality and compliance management.



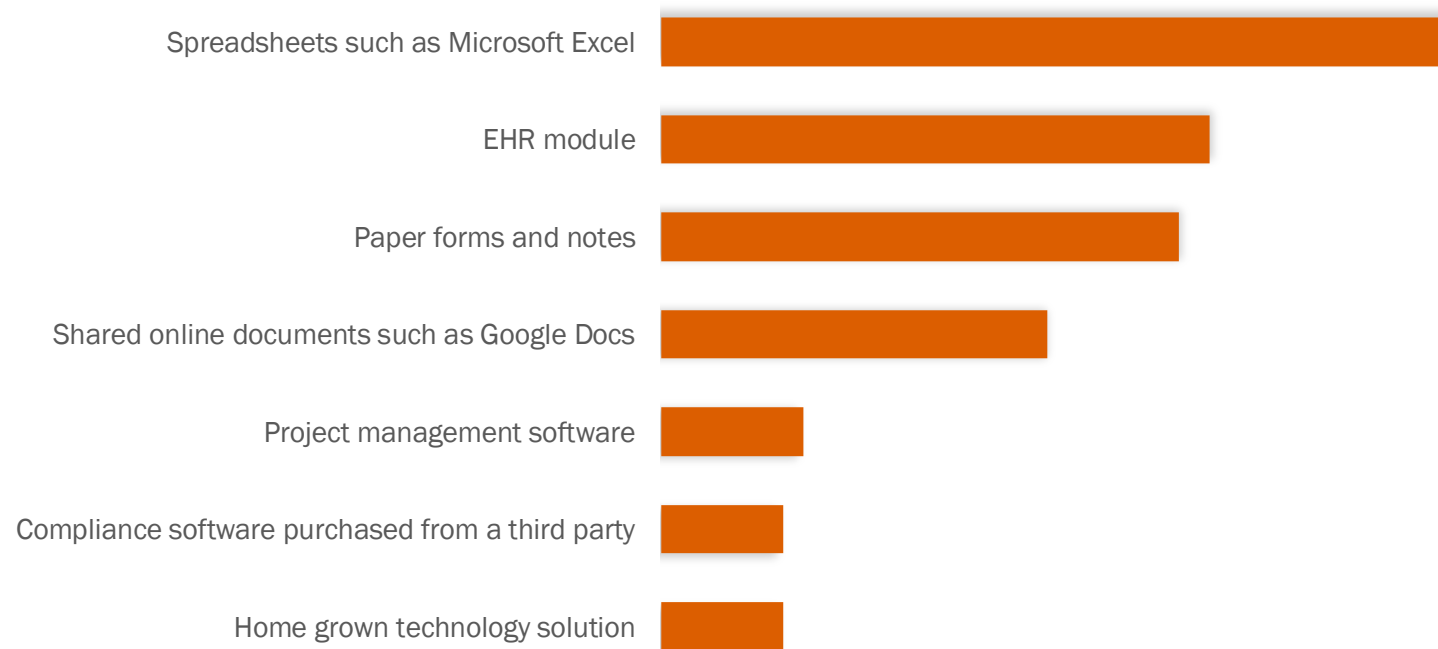
TOP QAPI CHALLENGES RANKED



Organizations are using inefficient, outdated methods to manage mission critical workflows

Compounding the problem of resource constraints, home health and hospice organizations are using inefficient and unsecure tools such as spreadsheets, shared documents and paper to manage compliance programs. The stakes associated with misplacing paperwork or a binder, or losing an electronic file are high.

TOOLS USED TO MANAGE COMPLIANCE PROGRAMS



There is a high level of interest in leveraging technology to help better manage and maintain compliance

Most respondents agree there is a need for technology to help them better manage their compliance programs. They want something that makes compliance easier and saves time, while giving confidence in survey readiness.

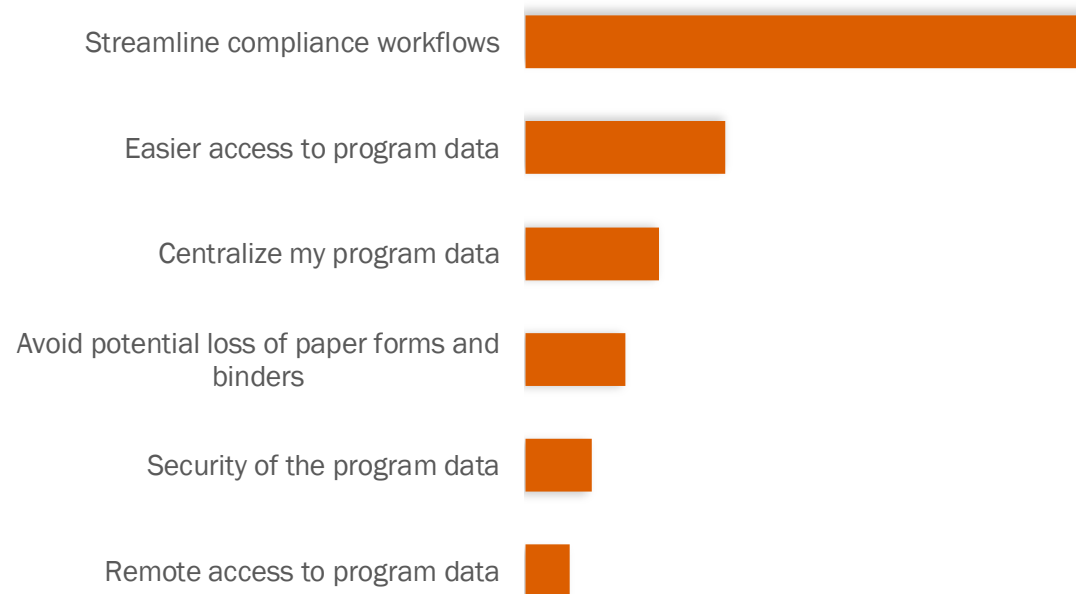
HOW TECHNOLOGY CAN HELP
